Title	Achieving a step change in the experience of end of life care: why and how?

Professor Bee Wee

Clinical Director for End of Life Care, NHS England

Professor Bee Wee is National Clinical Director for End of Life Care in NHS England for 2 days per week. In this role, she provides strategic leadership for improving end of life care across England. In 2015, she co-led the development and publication of the *Ambitions for Palliative and End of Life Care: A national framework for local action 2015-2020*. This framework was endorsed in the Government's response to the Review of Choice in End of Life Care in 2016.



Originally from Malaysia, she trained in medicine, then general practice, in Ireland and worked in Hong Kong, then became Consultant/ Senior Lecturer in Palliative Medicine, and later, Deputy Director of the Medical School, Southampton University. She moved to Oxford in 2003 as Consultant in Palliative Medicine at Sir Michael Sobell House, Fellow of Harris Manchester College and Associate Director of Clinical Studies at Oxford University, and Head of the Oxford WHO Collaborating Centre for Palliative Care. Her clinical and academic base remains in Oxford.

She is now Associate Professor at Oxford University, Visiting Professor at Oxford Brookes University and University of Worcester and Honorary Professor at Sichuan University, China. She also chairs the Quality Standards Advisory Committee for NICE as a regular commitment.

In her spare time, she enjoys cooking, eating and allotment gardening.
